It has changed from being the former operator of Sequoia Hospital to a Community Outreach institution supporting children's health insurance; Samaritan House; the nursing program; Redwood City School District nurses; Community grants programs; matching grants; the HeartSafe Program; and the Sequoia Hospital Foundation.

The mission of the District is to act as a catalyst and advocate ensuring access to healthcare for District residents for today and tomorrow.







Rotary District 5150 proudly sponsors Walking for Ben. This is the story of Walking for Ben. On November 1, 1998 Ben was diagnosed with megakaryoblastic leukemia. In an attempt to save Ben's life a bone marrow transplant was needed as well as blood donors and platelets. Members of various district 5150 Rotary Clubs immediately swung into action sponsoring blood donor and platelet drives as well as bone marrow typing. 2,500 people went to the various blood banks for Ben in district 5150. Ben died on January 4, 1999 and was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship within days.

The first Walking for Ben event was held May 8, 2004 and in 2005 two walking events were held in Menlo Park and San Jose. From these walks \$800,000 has been donated to The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society for research. Over 2,600 people have walked for Ben in these three walks. Our next walks will be October 5, 2006 in South San Francisco and October 7, 2006 in Menlo Park and October 22, 2006 in San Jose. Walking for Ben is the third largest walk in the country for The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

How it is being implemented by restricted access using fences searches and scanning devices in the San Francisco Bay Area and Internationally. There are requirements of disclosure for ships entering the territorial waters of the USA. There are certificates given to known

safe ships". Cargo manifests are reviewed; crews are profiled (politically correct or not); and dangerous cargo is noted.

The industry has implemented an Auto ID system (AIS) that is able to track a ship at all times. Some ships are subject to inspection by priority. Priority 1 is board prior to entry, 2 is board at pierside and 3 is for assumed safe ships that do not require boarding at all.





Last year almost 400 students (5th through 12th grade) from 48 schools throughout San Mateo County entered 370 projects in our fair which is held at the Hiller Aviation Museum in San Carlos.

The projects were in the categories of: biological; behavioral/health/social; physical; earth/space/environmental; materials; engineering, technology and mathematics. Many of the projects are amazing. Everything from a Mathematical model of the SARS epidemic, a flight simulator, a survey of teenage girls eating disorders and a bed making machine have been entered.

While the event continues throughout the week of February 4th:

- Sunday and Monday project check-in;
- Tuesday 1st Judging Night paper screening;




Still not satisfied, Linsey went back to law school, finished, passed the bar and has a practice representing entertainment and sports figures.

prison system since one half of the prisoners are

Bob Selinger, from the Rotary Club of Newport-Irvine and a Rotary volunteer in Zambia, gave us an insight into what is happening in the Southern one-third of Africa. He told us that South Africa is a time bomb ready to blow upon the death of Nelson Mandela. The Southern half of old Rhodesia, Zimbabwe is in virtual anarchy and, where it used to be the bread basket of Africa, is now unable to even grow enough food to feed its population. Bob settled on placing his resources in Zambia, the Northern half of old Rhodesia, which he stated, has a "guided democracy" and where Rotary is welcomed.

Bob is working on rehabilitating the Silichi Mission Hospital, which is 120 Kilometers out of Livingston, the capital. The hospital was built in 1944 and has never been upgraded since. There is electricity only one and one half hours a day when the generators are turned on. He is working on a clean water project for the hospital and we are helping. We have committed financial resources to the project and hope that Bob can pull off a miracle to aid the local population of some 10 million people.





Annie Varnesic, an audiologist and Damaris Divito, a speech and language pathologist from the Jean Weingarten Peninsula School for the Oral Deaf told us about their programs and activities. The school has some 54 students, most totally deaf from birth. About 80% of the students have cochlear implants that allow them to hear without using the ears. The implants work on magnetism, one magnet is

implanted under the skin with a computer chip at its center and the other magnet connected to a wire that leads to a battery operated microphone pack.

Resonances are transmitted directly to the auditory nerve allowing for the miracle of discernment of sound.

The case for finishing polio eradication A fresh approach for the final phase

In January 2007, PolioPlus entered a new era by adopting tailored approaches to reach the last children, in each of the last 4 endemic countries, with new eradication tools.

This move, from the 'one-size-fits-all' eradication strategy, is the single biggest development since PolioPlus was launched in 1985.

Polio can be eradicated

- Impact polio cases worldwide have fallen by 99% since PolioPlus was started in 1985.
- Polio Surveillance since 2004, new surveillance standards and laboratory processes have ensured that every country can detect every circulating poliovirus more rapidly than ever.
- Outbreak Control every re-infected country has already stopped its outbreak or is on the verge
 of doing so; since 2006, new international response guidelines stop outbreaks faster than ever.
- Finishing Eradication the poorest, most war-torn and most crowded countries on earth have stopped polio; new generation 'monovalent' polio vaccines provide even more potent tools for the last 4 endemic countries which, in December 2006, adopted new and tailored approaches:
 - o India: monthly polio campaigns will target the very young children who sustain polio;
 - Nigeria: new Immunization Plus Days will target the very high risk states where polio continues to circulate;
 - o Afghanistan & Pakistan: synchronized campaigns will target the populations moving across borders and living in insecure areas where poliovirus survives.

Polio should be eradicated

- A humanitarian legacy: already, 5 million children are walking who would have been paralyzed and more than 1.5 million lives have been saved. Switching to a 'control' strategy, instead of finishing eradication, would condemn 10 million children to polio over the next 40 years alone.
- A financial responsibility: once polio is eradicated, the developing world can save over US\$1 billion each year. Polio eradication will also help secure the future earning potential of children and reduce the massive costs of polio that are now borne by the poorest families and communities.

The case for finishing PolioPlus is compelling.

The opportunity to finish PolioPlus is unprecedented.

Rotary's PolioPlus legacy will last in perpetuity.

Help THE Mission




