**Self-publishing** is the publication of any book or other media by the author of the work, without the involvement of an established third-party publisher. A self-published physical book is said to be **privately printed**. The author is responsible for and in control of the entire process, including, in the case of a book, the design of the cover and interior, formats, price, distribution, marketing and public relations. The authors can do it all themselves or outsource all or part of the process to companies that offer these services.

The key distinguishing characteristic of self-publishing is that the author has decided to publish his or her work independent of a publishing house. In the past, self-published authors had to spend considerable amounts of money preparing a book for publication, purchasing bulk copies of their title, and finding a place to store their inventory. Print-On-Demand and e-book technology have allowed authors to have a book printed or digitally delivered only when an order has been placed.

In 2008, for the first time in history, more books were self-published than those published traditionally. In 2009, 76% of all books released were self-published, while publishing houses reduced the number of books they produced.<sup>[1]</sup> According to Robert Kroese, "the average return of the self-published book is £500".<sup>[2]</sup>

Technological advances have enabled this growth:

- Online retailing, wherein dominant players like Amazon.com have enticed readers away from bookstores into an online environment.
- Print-On-Demand (POD) technology which can produce a quality product equal to those produced by traditional publishers – in the past, you could easily identify a self-published title because of its quality.
- Technological advances with e-book readers and tablet computers that enhance readability and allow readers to "carry" numerous books in a concise, portable product.
- · Access to global distribution channels via online retailers.







As we get started on our membership drive this week, I thought I would share some successful tips on recruiting new members!

- "ASK" a sometimes forgotten theme which needs to be regularly mentioned to anyone who wants to know how to get into membership recruitment. A good beginning!
- Always carry
   your **Business Card** . . .
   your name and contact

information can both <u>start</u> and <u>close</u> a valuable productive Rotary conversation.

- 3. "Timing" can be everything! Catching a good prospect at the wrong moment is a <u>waste</u> and a deterrent to future efforts. Patience . . . the time will come.
- 4. "Age" keep an <u>open</u> mind always . . . especially to retired, experienced, able people who are looking to be "needed."
- 5. **Be a good listener** . . . and feed your recruit in small "mouthfuls." Too much Rotary "stuff" will choke not only the interest but also friendship. "<u>Direct</u>" your answers not only to the question asked, and to the logical next question . . . but listen, listen, listen!!!
- 6. Select" potential members from a list of **club service vocational needs** . . (i.e. photography, printer, writer, construction foreman, equipment rental, restaurant owner, etc.) Remember there are some members that will not want another member with the same club service listing as them.

- 7. A key area often over-looked is the necessary element in wanting to become a Rotarian – not just a member of a Rotary Club. The "want to" is <u>often</u> the missed ingredient in the application/recruitment procedure. (Particularly a commitment to helping/securing others – as opposed to selling, self improvement, self marketing.)
- 8. The amount of time required to complete the New Member Process can well determine the recruit's length of Rotary Tenure. Remember the KISS principle it may help keep things moving. A well manicured, prioritized and well-publicized New Member Process procedure is critical to recruitment and retention. (2 weeks to 1 month = more range, enough time to process people.)
- 9. The media can help to identify potential Rotarians. Face it: virtually every positive piece of news focuses on a Make A Difference Person. By letting that person know of Rotary's appreciation/interest, particularly when that person lives in your community, may be the start of a "new Rotarian." (And . . the effort says a lot about Rotary's support for community members/projects.)
- 10. **Follow up!** Remember to follow up with potential new members and make them feel part of the club.



# PORT HOSTS 77th Annual South Bay Opening Day of Sailing Season May 2nd

The 77th annual South Bay Opening Day of the sailing season, featuring a decorated boat parade and free public activities, is scheduled for Saturday, May 2, at the Port of Redwood City. This year's theme is "Pirates of the South Bay."

The decorated boat parade and blessing of the fleet starts at 11 a.m. and is best viewed from the observation deck at the Port of Redwood City. Spectators can vote for their favorite decorated boat to determine which one will receive the coveted "Spectators Choice Award."

The public viewing experience will be enhanced in wake of last month's completion of improvements to the public access and landscape areas between Seaport Center and the Fishing Pier. Improvements include:

- Reconstruction of the sidewalks, parking areas, benches, and ADA access long the waterfront promenade to improve views and connectivity.


